POW WOW Many of you will attend Pow Wows this summer. We are reminded of the following courtesies:

THE DANCE CIRCLE The circle is sacred and must be respected, and carefully walked upon. Please do not enter the Dance Circle unless the emcee calls for the public to join.

PHOTOGRAPHS Pictures are not to be taken within the circle, or of activities occurring within the circle. If you wish to take pictures or video of the Native Americans in their regalia, please ask for permission before clicking.

REGALIA The clothes and accessories that the Native Americans wear and carry are both sacred and priceless. Please do not touch any person's regalia without their permission, as this can show great disrespect.

CRAFTS The craftwork displayed may have taken days or even months to complete, therefore, young children should be cautioned against handling these items.  
CHILDREN Adult supervision is requested for all children.
