1994 SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT

Excerpts from the Report of

Miss Eunice Connally, Scholarship Chairman

The 1994 recipient of the \$500.00 CSDIW Scholarship was Miss Julie Shagen, a Chippewa Indian from Mt. Pleasant, MI. Julie is a student at Central Michigan University and has plans to teach school. Julie was one of six applicants. All applications were reviewed and rated by a field of five judges, two public school teachers, two college professors, and one minister.

Since the 1993 Annual Council there have been approximately 53 inquiries about our scholarship program, due to our growing number of listings with various organizations and institutions.

The following is taken in part from the application of Miss Shagen.

More than anything else, I want to teach Native American students at the elementary school level. I believe that children are the most important resource a nation has.

Early intervention is crucial in order to prepare children to lead healthy, productive lives, and contribute to their communities.

Because I am a Chippewa Indian, I have a special interest and compassion for Native American people. I grew up on or near the Bay Mills and Sault Ste. Marie reservations, and am related to members of both tribes. Bay Mills is one of the reservations east of the Mississippi River that has its own Tribally Controlled Community College. There are not yet enough trained Native American members to fill needed teaching positions. I believe I can best benefit my people by becoming a teacher, and a positive role model. I plan to return to my home and teach, hoping to reach those children who are potential drop outs, and inspiring them to achieve their potential and realize their responsibilities to themselves and their community. I hope to pass on to my students, the optimism and compassion that I was shown by my teachers.
