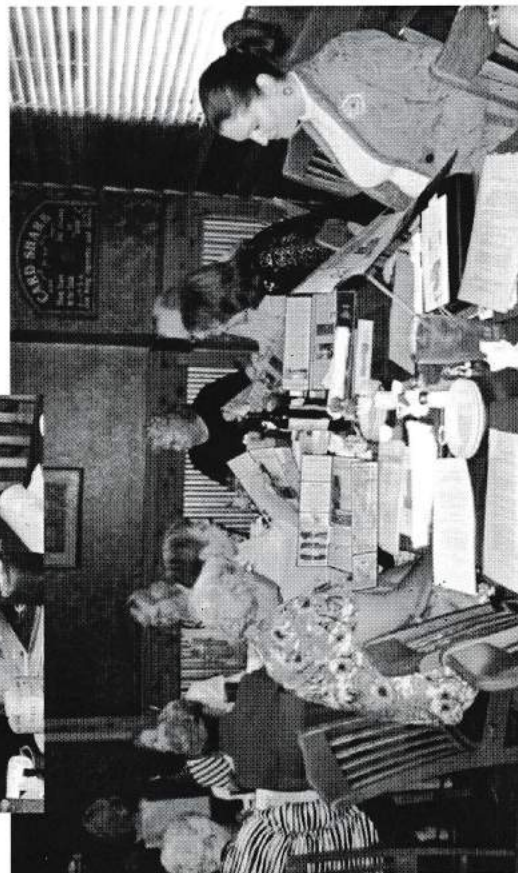
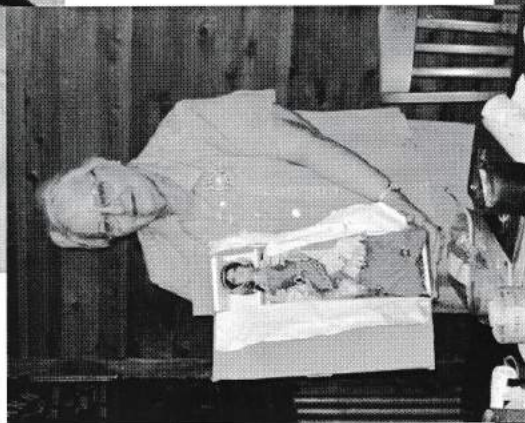

March 19, 1912, February 18, 2006



In 1987 Dr. James Edwards along with others met to form the men's Formation of the Continental Society Sons of the Indian Wars. Dr. Edwards lived across the street from the Avery's and had come To invite Lawrence to join the new Georgia Society, and encourage Virginia to organize a complementary society for women, Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars. The following spring April 1988 The Avery's were attending lineage society meetings in Washington DC They met with Wayne and Doris Gilbert from Wagoner, Okla. and discussed formation of such a women's society. Virginia returned to Atlanta and started a letter and telephone campaign to find members. The Georgia State Society was organized 26 April 1988.

Doris Gilbert organized the Oklahoma Society in Tulsa 6 May 1989. Missouri was organized by Nancy Ragsdale 23 September 1989. Almost immediately the Calumet was published and became the official news and information source for the society.

Virginia set about organizing Governors for Arizona, Florida, Iowa, Indiana, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Michigan, Pennsylvania and Texas. Virginia became the first Governor General and the 1989 Directory was published listing 1988-1990, Officers General and 150 members. The first 91 members were known as founding members and the next 43 were charter members.

Barbara Chastain of the Georgia Society designed the flag and Patricia Hopkins composed the salute to the CSDIW Flag. Brochures were printed outlining eligibility and the Object was formulated. Marion Pollard of the Missouri Society provided the motto and colors. Attempts were made with little success to write bylaws and obtain Internal Revenue Identification numbers.

MRS. ENVER B. HOFF, SR. (DOROTHY ELEANOR CORN)
1992 - 1994

In 1992 Dorothy Hoff, of Marietta, Georgia became Governor General.

She chose as her project to make the society a legal structure by drawing up bylaws in compliance with Internal Revenue Service codes by obtaining Charitable Institution status for the society. Patricia Hopkins, Treasurer General, spent her energy obtaining the proper IRS forms and identification number as well as working with insignia suppliers.

In 1992 Massachusetts organized, Illinois, Indiana and New York in 1993 and in 1994 Iowa, California, Michigan, South

Carolina and Texas organized. By 1993 membership reached the required 500 for the publication of Volume 1 Ancestor Index.

During 1992-1994 the Indian Scholarship was initiated by Denise Rice and implemented by Eunice Connolly Carr. Indian Schools were contacted and questioned about need. Input was enthusiastic and showed the greatest need at the Junior and Senior college levels. There was a demand for Indians in the social services and educational fields to go into practice on a reservation, becoming role models for Indian youth. These objectives and Indian descent formed the criteria for application, good grades were a plus, financial need was a factor, but not primary. The society was searching for the best qualified student. An interest bearing Scholarship Fund was set up to be funded by gifts from the State Societies, individual members and money raising projects. The \$500.00 was the annual Scholarship amount.

1996-1998**



Susan Harriet Moore Chamberlain was elected Governor General at the Annual Council meeting held in Atlanta Georgia in September 1996.

Susan chose as her project to increase the principal of the scholarship fund. She designed gold metal pins to acknowledge member's contribution of \$25.00 to \$1,000.00 to the fund. The red tote bag was her design and proceeds still go to the fund. Insignia had been secured from various companies until Susan, working with Shirley Spuhler, designed new officer general, state and chapter insignia and arranged for J. E. Caldwell & Company to supply all of our insignia. It was completed in 2004.

In 1997 the first Canadian Provincial Society was organized when Alberta joined with Arizona to form a single society.

The District of Columbia and Tennessee also organized in 1997. Organizing Governors were names for Louisiana, Utah, Virginia dn Kentucky. That Spring the Georgia Society formed the first chapter and called it Coweta. In the Fall 1997 New Echota was organized by Jean Belew and Truth Ashby Gamblin was the first Chapter Governor.

Susan was Ma. 1st State Governor 1989-1991, 2nd Deputy General 1992-1994, MA. State Corr. Sec. 1992-1994, 1st Deputy Governor 1994-1996, MA., State Chaplain 1995-1997, Governor General 1996-1998. Susan continued as Scholarship Pins Chairman general 2003-2008 and Advisor to the Governor General.

**TREATY OF TELLICO BLOCKHOUSE, TENNESSEE
ORGANIZED MARCH 1, 2008**

The Treaty of Tellico Blockhouse Chapter, Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars, held their organizational meeting March 1, at Green Meadow County Club in Alcoa, TN. The objective of the society, first organized in 1988 in Atlanta Ga., is to assist and encourage the preservation of records and historic sites associated with native and immigrant American ancestors. The chapter was named after the Tellico Blockhouse, an early American outpost located along the Little Tennessee River in Monroe County, several treaties between the United States and the Cherokee Nation were negotiated at the Tellico Blockhouse between 1794 and 1805. MRS. DENISE (D) GUERIN RICE, was elected Governor General in September 1998 in Atlanta Georgia, Denise served six years as the Registrar General. Membership has and is uppermost on her mind and with her encouragement and the concentrated efforts of Marie Russell the Texas Society grew to over 100 members and formed two chapters, TEJAS & GERONIMO. An organizing Governor was named for North Carolina. Denise gave tremendous support to growth of the Scholarship Fund. She began having order forms for printed supplies, insignia, and membership certificates, in the Calumet to better reach the membership and had Gladys Scott of Michigan compile our first Ritual. Denise was Registrar General 1992-1994, 1994-1996-1996-1998, Membership Certificate chairman General and Yearbook Chairman General 1994-1996, 1996-1998, Governor General 1999-2000, Georgia State Governor 2001-2003, Microfilm Chairman General 2000-2008, Ancestor Book Chairman General 2000-2008, Gillman Director Chairman General with Atlanta History Center 2008 -

Shirle Charlene Lamb Williams in the year 2000 brought a new millennium and the sixth Governor General, from Tulsa Oklahoma. With a long Cherokee lineage and real interest in history, her projects centered in building stability and permanent knowledge about the society. To add to the Scholarship Fund a small booklet was published and sold. Indian Wars and Passive Activities, 1607 - 1900 is a brief narrative about each of the areas of membership eligibility, written by our members and edited by Marlene Wilkinson of Millington Tennessee. Details were worked out for the permanent storage of our lineage papers, records and scrapbooks at the Atlanta History Center. Insignia problems were solved with Caldwell and arrangements made for them to weave sashes, thus giving Dorothy Hoff a rest from hand sewing them all these years. A Marker Chairman was named to design a marker for historical sites and member's graves. A Handbook was started to meet the society needs. Texas Scholarship fund amount jumped to \$1,000.00 in 2000

The tragic events of 9/11, 2001 and grounding of all air travel caused the cancellation of our September Council and was a setback in the progress of the work of the society but we did grow, finishing the term of office at membership #976. In 2001 an organizing governor was named for Florida ending 13 years of failed attempts in that state. In 2002 an organizing governor was named for Mississippi and Georgia had four chapters: Coweta, New Echota, Augusta Treaty and Brushy Creek

Shirle has remained active in Oklahoma and as State organizing Secretary for 2007-2008, oversaw the formation and chartering of the state's first two chapter, Indian Territory and Oklahoma Territory. This was a special project for the 2007 Centennial Celebration of Oklahoma Statehood, which united these two territories into one state.

The first Associate Member, Governor General Imogene Basham Belew, Georgia, was a Native of Oklahoma, where her father was born before statehood there and she wanted to be a member of Oklahoma chapters also. Shirle was Ok. State Historian 1989-1991, St. Governor 1994-1996, 1997-1998, State rec & Corr Sec. 1998-2000, Governor General 2000-2002.

CSDIW, Name and Purpose

The Name of this organization shall be The Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars. This Society is incorporated as a non-profit, non-stock corporation. The purpose is exclusively charitable, literary and educational within the meaning of section 501 © (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law. The Society shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal Income Tax under section 501 © (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

CSDIW, OBJECT

The Object of this Society shall be to assist and encourage the preservation of records and historic sites associated with our native and immigrant American Ancestors, to cherish the memory of those native and immigrant American who waged war and/or committed other acts of hostility one toward the other in defense of their people's freedom, liberty and ideals, to strengthen fellowship and to encourage cooperation between descendants of native and immigrant Americans, to foster in a spirit of patriotism, the support and enforcement of all treaties and laws made and agreed upon between the State and Federal governments and the several tribes, bands and nations of Native American, to publish a lineage book of the names and ancestral data of members of the Society, and original materials related to this aspect of American History.

CSDIW ELIGIBILITY

Any woman who is a citizen of either the United States of America, The Dominion of Canada, or Mexico, of good moral character, who is not less than sixteen years of age, shall be eligible to membership, provided that she shall be personally acceptable to the Society and shall be the lineal descendant of a Native or immigrant American ancestor who participated in any capacity in actual hostilities, one against the other, or in any other activity with each other, during the period May 14, 1607 to 1900.

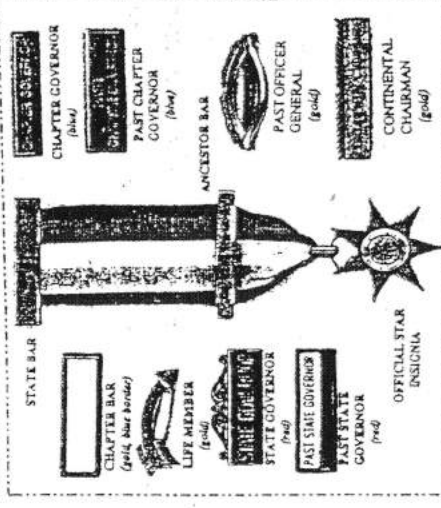
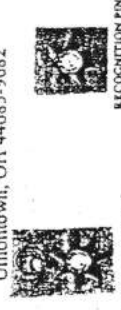
