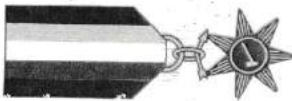

ANNUAL COUNCIL STANDING RULES

1. All members and guests in attendance at the 20th Annual Council shall register with the Credentials committee.
2. All in attendance are requested to be in their seats promptly for all meetings of the Annual Council.

DEBATE AND MOTIONS

3. All main motions presented at the meetings of the Annual Council shall be in writing, signed by the maker and seconded, and sent at once to the desk of the Recording Secretary General. The maker of the motion shall rise and state her name and state.
4. A member shall not speak more than twice during the same day to the same question or longer than two minutes at one time.
5. Only registered members of the Society shall be entitled to make motions, debate and vote.

REPORTS

6. The Presiding Officer only shall be addressed when presenting reports.
7. All reports shall be typewritten, signed in ink and mailed to the Governor General: three copies, one for the Governor General, one for the Recording Secretary and one for her files.
8. Officers General except Governor General and Treasurer General reports shall be limited to three minutes.
9. Absent State Governor Reports shall be read by the Second Deputy General unless a member of her State Society is present. These reports are limited to three minutes.

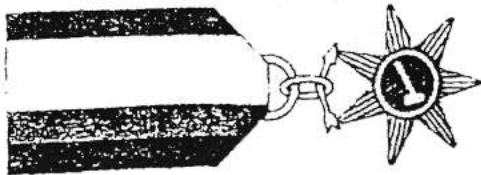

 NAME & PURPOSE OBJECT ELIGIBILITY ACCEPTABLE SERVICE**

CSDIW, Name and Purpose:

The Name of this organization shall be The Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars. This Society is incorporated as a non-profit, non-stock corporation. The purpose is exclusively charitable, literary and educational within the meaning of section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law. The Society shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal Income Tax under section 501 ©(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

CSDIW - OBJECT:

The Object of this Society shall be to assist and encourage the preservation of records and historic sites associated with our native and immigrant American Ancestors, to cherish the memory of those native and immigrant American who waged war and/or committed other acts of hostility one toward the other in defense of their people's freedom, liberty and ideals, to strengthen fellowship and to encourage cooperation between descendants of native and immigrant Americans, to foster in a spirit of patriotism, the support and enforcement of all treaties and laws made and agreed upon between the State and Federal governments and the several tribes, bands and nations of Native American, to publish a lineage book of the names and ancestral data of members of the Society, and original materials related to this aspect of American History.

CSDIW ELIGIBILITY:

Any woman who is a citizen of either the United States of America, The Dominion of Canada, or Mexico, of good moral character, who is not less than sixteen years of age, shall be eligible to membership, provided that she shall be personally acceptable to the Society and shall be the lineal descendant of a Native or immigrant American ancestor who participated in any capacity in actual hostilities, one against the other, or in any other activity with each other, during the period May 14, 1607 to 1900.
