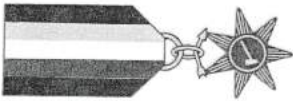

STATE GOVERNOR REPORTS

State Governors and/or Deputy State Governors in attendance and reporting were: CA, DC, FL, GA, OK, TX and The Organizing Secretary General, Cher Bucknam, asked the Governor General to clarify what was decided at the Executive Board Meeting, 07 April, regarding the formation of Chapters in VA so that all involved parties in the room would be informed. Governor General Weber asked the 2nd Deputy Governor General, Shelby Ward, who was Acting Parliamentarian at the Executive Board Meeting, to read the Bylaws pertaining to the eligibility requirements and the organization of chapters. It was also clarified that the Executive Board had stated that each new Chapter must form bylaws and they must conform with the State and the National bylaws. The Governor General was asked to also share that the Executive Board determined in their meeting that the Daughters of the Stars could continue to form a chapter and the remaining Virginia State members would need to organize into a chapter themselves. Then, the Virginia State Society, when the second (Eastern area) chapter is formed and by-laws written, would consist of two chapters.

The meeting was recessed for a buffet lunch.

Announcements were made.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:40 p.m.

Due to time constraints, only reports of the National Chairman and State Governors present were read. All reports were filed with the minutes.

Karen Hall, Insignia Archive Chairman, reported that two National Officer insignia had been repaired.

Helen Werner, Yearbook Chairman mentioned again that the new yearbook is ready. The concept of emailing this document versus printing and distributing hard copies to all was discussed.

A motion was made that the Yearbooks be emailed immediately to those members who want it in that format [electronic] and printed for those that want that form [hard copy]. The hard copy format will be available upon request for \$10.00 each, made payable to the Treasurer General. The motion passed.

The book to be sent at this time is just the Yearbook with member roster listings, not the Handbook. An electronic copy will be the first sent by email to all Officers, Honorary Governors General and State governors by the Corresponding Secretary General and a free hard copy to those State Governors without email. Those buying a hard copy will make their check payable to the Treasurer General and the Corresponding Secretary General will be reimbursed for her printing and mailing expenses by the Society.

The Governor General mentioned that she has a great many of the old yearbooks in her possession. Since the member roster section is out of date, it was suggested that the bylaw section be pulled out and used as a reference when the Society discusses bylaw changes in September.

Handbook Chairman Sharon Stine is working on the new Handbook and checking to make sure it is not in conflict with the bylaws. It will be ready by the September

OFFICER REPORTS

Governor General Weber commented on her visit with the California State Society and thanked CA State President Cathy Matranga for a wonderful time. Governor General Weber reported that she is currently serving as the Calumet Editor.

1st Deputy Governor Sally Hlavay, 2nd Deputy Governor Shelby Ward and the Recording Secretary Karen Miller reported on their duties this past year. (Reports attached)

One death had been reported-to-date to the Chaplain General Karen Hall - Rozzella James of Oklahoma, mother of member Susan Brewer. The death date was reported as June 2009. (Report attached)

Helene Werner, Corresponding Secretary General shared that she has compiled the latest edition of the CSDIW yearbook and it is ready to print at the Governor General's request. (Report attached)

Organizing Secretary Cher Bucknam reported on the progress of organizing two new chapters, the Daughters of the Stars in Virginia and the Oconee War Chapter in Georgia. (Report attached)

A motion was made that the Organizing Secretary General be allowed to submit the proposed bylaw [amendments] to the bylaw committee for inclusion in the bylaws to be voted on in September and for approval of the step by step instructions to be printed in the Handbook. The motion carried.

A motion was made to add to the Organizing Secretary General's motion that the step by step reports go to the Handbook Committee for review and qualifications. The motion passed.

Registrar General Ann Williams reported that we started this term with membership number #1375 and we are now at #1492. Ann reminded all that a checklist for submission of papers has been created and published in the Calumet. All prospective new members and those compiling supplements need to use and submit this form with their paperwork. (Report attached)

A motion was made to include the CSDIW application checklist in the Handbook. The motion passed.

The minutes of the 2009 Board of Management Meeting in Oklahoma City, OK, were read by the Recording Secretary General Karen Miller. It was moved to accept the minutes as read. Motion passed.

The Recording Secretary General read the recommendations from the Spring Executive Board.

(1) To name the new Georgia Chapter the Oconee War Chapter. The recommendation was adopted.

Treasurer General Barbara Griffith gave the finance report. She specifically asked that all donations be sent with a note specifying what fund the contribution is to be credited to and/or who is to be honored or memorialized. Donations need to be a separate check from the dues check.

A motion was made to transfer the money returned to the Society, from the disbanded chapters of Kentucky and Ohio, to the general scholarship fund. The amount transferred being \$388.33. The motion carried.

It was moved that the CSDIW keep the [old] Treasurers records for five (5) years, including a copy of each annual report. The motion carried.

It was moved that we save the two volumes of hardbound, handwritten, original membership lists. The motion carried.

A discussion was held in regards to the current society investments maturing in the near future. Suggestions were made that the Treasurer General look into investing the portion of the society funds not needed for the general operating expenses in long term maturities of certificates of deposit and/or laddering CD investments so as to accrue a larger percentage of interest than a twelve (12) month CD generally offers.

A list was passed around the room for review and verification of information needed for the annual IRS filing. It was confirmed and stressed that each State and Chapter Officer must complete a conflict of interest form and submit it to the Treasurer General.

The need for keeping State and Chapter Officer information updated was discussed. It was decided that the current forms printed in the Calumet which need to be completed by all State and Chapter Officers will in the future clearly reflect to whom they are to be sent. It will be the duty of the Governor General to see that each National Officer receives a copy of all submitted forms she receives from the State and Chapter Officers that apply to each office.

**CONTINENTAL SOCIETY DAUGHTERS OF INDIAN WARS
NAME & PURPOSE OBJECT ELIGIBILITY ACCEPTABLE SERVICE-**

CSDIW, Name and Purpose:

The Name of this organization shall be The Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars. This Society is incorporated as a non-profit, non-stock corporation. The purpose is exclusively charitable, literary and educational within the meaning of section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law. The Society shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal Income Tax under section 501 ©(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

CSDIW - OBJECT:

The Object of this Society shall be to assist and encourage the preservation of records and historic sites associated with our native and immigrant American Ancestors, to cherish the memory of those native and immigrant American who waged war and/or committed other acts of hostility one toward the other in defense of their people's freedom, liberty and ideals, to strengthen fellowship and to encourage cooperation between descendants of native and immigrant Americans, to foster in a spirit of patriotism, the support and enforcement of all treaties and laws made and agreed upon between the State and Federal governments and the several tribes, bands and nations of Native American, to publish a lineage book of the names and ancestral data of members of the Society, and original materials related to this aspect of American History.

CSDIW ELIGIBILITY:

Any woman who is a citizen of either the United States of America, The Dominion of Canada, or Mexico, of good moral character, who is not less than sixteen years of age, shall be eligible to membership, provided that she shall be personally acceptable to the Society and shall be the lineal descendant of a Native or immigrant American ancestor who participated in any capacity in actual hostilities, one against the other, or in any other activity with each other, during the period May 14, 1607 to 1900.

22nd ANNUAL COUNCIL MEETING**

April 8, 2010 – Washington D.C.

The Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars Spring Board of Management met Thursday, 08 April 2010 at the Holiday Inn Central, Washington, D.C. The meeting was called to order by Governor General Marcia Weber at 9:20 a.m.

The Invocation was given by Chaplain General Karen Hall. The Pledge to the Flag of the United States was led by 2nd Deputy Governor General Shelby Ward. The American's Creed was led by Librarian General Barbara McMullin. 1st Deputy Governor General, Sally Hlavay, read the Objects of the Society.

Governor General Weber welcomed all. Each person in attendance introduced themselves. In attendance were all National Officers, the Parliamentarian General, four State Governors, Two Deputy State Governors and invited member guests. 3. Be accepted in, or already attend an accredited college or University, enrolled in an undergraduate program and preferably entering or in his/her Junior Year!
4. Maintain a 3.0 average and carry at least 10 (ten) quarter hours or 8 (eight) semester hours. This allows for a work/study program and is required for consideration.

To qualify for a renewal of the scholarship award, the recipient must submit:

1. A written statement of financial need and verification of current address.
2. An official transcript of grades for the last 2 (two) semesters or last 3 (three) quarters of academic work.
