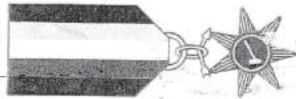

comfortable.

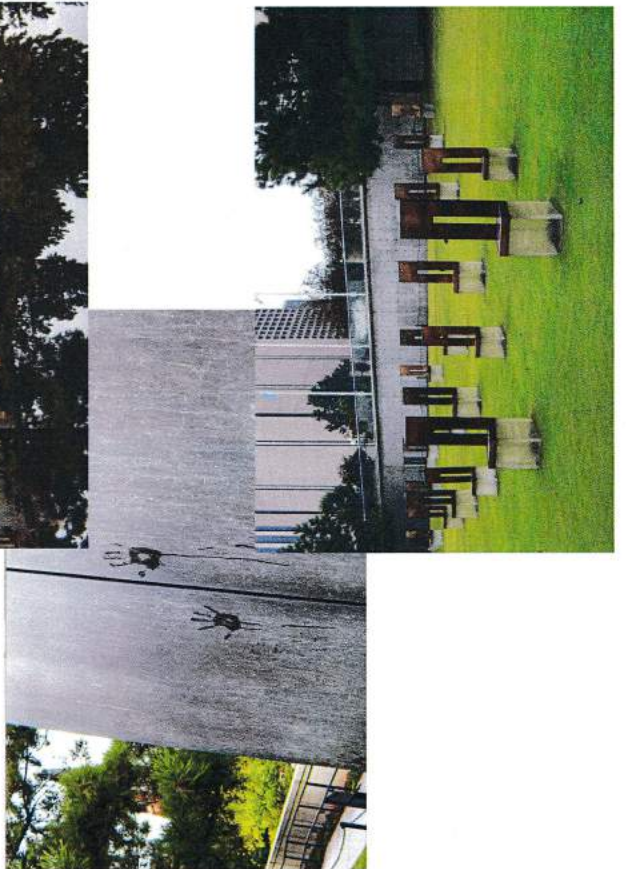
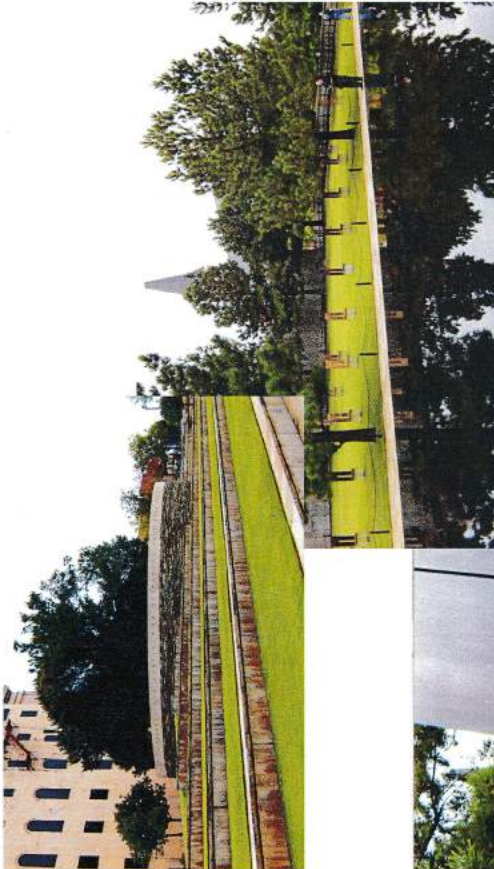
BLUE: represents the West Wind which brought the night so the Indian could rest.

A memorial service was conducted by Chaplain General Karen Hall. Reports of the State Societies were read for Alabama, California, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Kansas, Massachusetts, Michigan, Ohio, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia [written reports attached]

Committee Reports were filed with the Recording Secretary General. [reports attached]

A time of giving was held. Contributions were accepted from the Virginia State Society (\$125) and the Texas State Society (\$200 for General Scholarship Fund, \$200 for the Avery Scholarship and \$100 given through the state by the Geronimo Chapter for the General Scholarship.)

It was moved that **the Bylaws Committee be directed to add to Article XI, a Section 12 -- "A state whose membership falls below 10 shall be informed that they have one year to increase their membership or they will be automatically disbanded."** The motion passed.

At the direction of the Governor General, the floor was open for nominations for the 2010 Nominating Committee -- three members shall constitute this committee. Nominated were: Jean Belew (GA), Judy Farrigan (GA), Carla Odom (DC), Mary Walker (TX). The nominations were closed. A written ballot was taken with Helene Werner and Robin Towns serving as tellers. Elected to the 2010 Nominating Committee were Chairman Mary Walker, Judy Farrigan and Carla Odom. A motion was made and accepted to destroy the ballots.

Governor General Weber appointed Tommie Elaine Shattuck as a new Organizing Chapter Governor for a new Georgia Chapter.

It was announced that Missouri had been contacted to see if they could host the 2010 Council Meeting in St. Louis. If they cannot, Virginia has offered to host the event in Richmond, VA.

It was also announced by 1st Deputy Governor Sally Hlavay that the April 2010 Spring Board Meeting will be held 08 April at the Holiday Inn Central, Washington, DC. Room accommodations have been arranged at the hotel, \$169 double occupancy, rooms booked April 6-19. Please ask for the Heritage Society block of rooms to get the reduced rate. A Friendship Dinner is tentatively planned for that Thursday night at the National Press Club. Details will be forthcoming in the Callumet.

Chaplain Karen Hall gave the benediction and the meeting was adjourned at 3:00 p.m.

The 21st Council Meeting of the Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars was called to order at 10:15 a.m. on 19 September 2009, at the Marriott Renaissance Hotel, Oklahoma City, OK by Governor General, Marcia Weber.

The Invocation was given by Chaplain General Karen Hall. 2nd Deputy Governor General Shelby Ward led the pledge to the Flag of the United States of America. The Salute to the Banner of the CSDIW was led by Karen Avery Miller, Recording Secretary General and the American's Creed by Cheryl Bucknam, Organizing Secretary General. 1st Deputy Governor General, Sally Hlavay read the Object of the Society.

The Credential Report was given by Cindy Henderson and was adopted with 44 members, 2 guests registered.

The Standing Rules were read by the 2nd Deputy Governor General, Shelby Ward, and adopted.

Barbara Brown presented the Program and it was adopted as corrected [insert under Officers, the name of Karen A. Miller, Recording Secretary General]

Office Reports were given by all of the National Officers except for Fay McKinney, Corresponding Secretary General who was not in attendance. [Written reports attached]

During the reporting of the Treasurer General, Barbara Griffith made a recommendation to adopt the 2009-210 Budget – the budget was adopted. Discussion was held over whether the Society and/or Officers were bonded in CSDIW. It was stated that they were not and had never been in the past. A motion was made that the question of bonding be investigated and the results be reported in April 2010 at the Spring Board of Management. The motion carried.

When the meeting recessed at 11:15 a.m., The Shakeford Family Singers, children ranging in age from 10 to 19, entertained members and guests by singing several musical selections in their native Choctaw language as the luncheon program.

The meeting resumed at 1:55 p.m.

THE IRS IS WATCHING US CLOSELY AND WE MUST FILE...
We could lose our Tax Exempt Status for not filing...
I repeat ALL STATE AND CHAPTER TREASURERS MUST FILE....
7. Life membership under 60 \$250.00 Over 60 \$200.00
8. Scholarship donation checks MUST be separate checks.
9. ALL Caldwell orders MUST be sent to the National Treasurer. I must sign the order. Make sure you are using the latest Caldwell form re: \$8.00 shipping fee dated Aug. 2008.
Some information in the Calumet last time was incorrect shipping prices.
People are still using very old forms with incorrect prices.
Now I will be sending the old forms back to you to redo the order.
The checks will also be incorrect, and you will need a new check with correct amounts.

INDIAN SCHOLARSHIPS

To qualify for the scholarship, each applicant must meet the following criteria:

1. Be an enrolled tribal member.
2. Plan to work with other Native Americans upon your graduation from College. Career goals should involve working with Native Americans.
3. Be accepted in, or already attend an accredited college or University, enrolled in an undergraduate program and preferably entering or in his/her Junior Year!
4. Maintain a 3.0 average and carry at least 10 (ten) quarter hours or 8 (eight) semester hours. This allows for a work/study program and is required for consideration.

To qualify for a renewal of the scholarship award, the recipient must submit:

1. A written statement of financial need and verification of current address.
2. An official transcript of grades for the last 2 (two) semesters or last 3 (three) quarters of academic work.
