

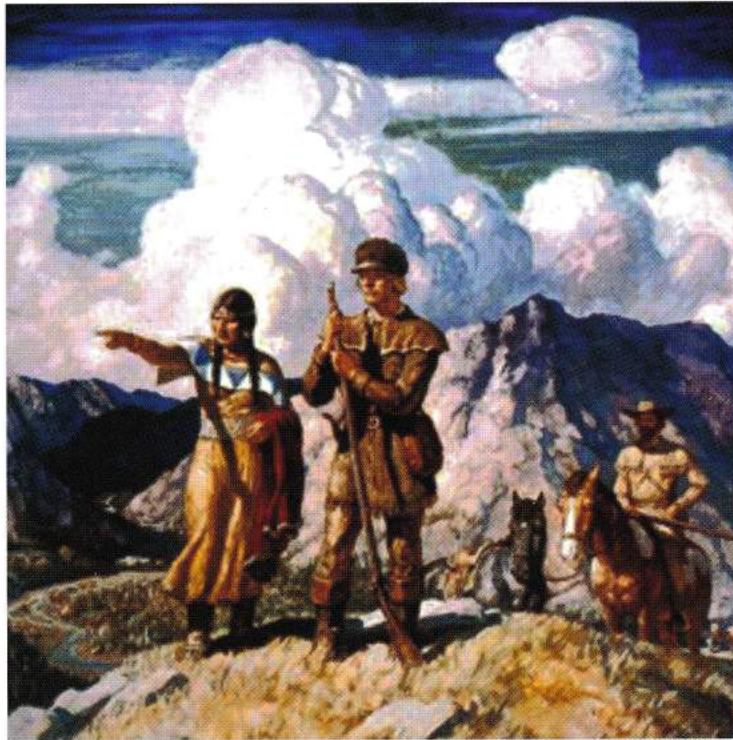

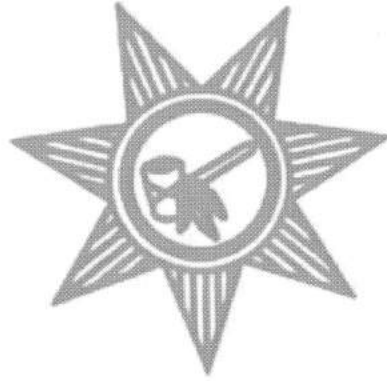

Minutes of the 22nd Annual Council Meeting

18 September 2010 --- St. Louis, MO
Karen Avery Miller, Recording Secretary General 2008-2010

The 22nd Annual Council Meeting of The Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars was called to order at 9:50 am by Governor General Marcia Weber.

Chaplain General Karen Hall gave the invocation.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by Honorary Governor General Susan Chamberlain. Honorary Governor General Denise Rice led the pledge to the CSDIW flag.

Recording Secretary General Karen Miller read the Roll Call of Officers, Honoraries, State Governors and Continental Chairman. (attendance list attached). The credential report was given by Bernice Wulff announcing that 31 members were in attendance. A quorum was met.

It was moved that the program as printed with necessary changes be adopted as the agenda. The motion passed.

Officer General reports were given by the following Officers: Governor General, Marcia Weber; 1st Deputy Governor, Sally Hlavay; 2nd Deputy Governor, Shelby Ward; Chaplain General, Karen Hall; Recording Secretary General, Karen Miller; Corresponding Secretary General, Helene Werner; Registrar General, Ann Williams; Historian General, Carla Odom.

Reports sent by those Officers not in attendance were read: Organizing Secretary General, Cher Bucknam; Treasurer General, Barbara Griffith and Librarian General, Barbara Brown McMullin.

The Registrar General reported that 147 new members have been approved during the Weber Administration. Also, two new chapters have chartered - Indian Springs and Oconee War, both in Georgia. The Assistant Registrar General reported that 1 supplement has been verified since the April Spring Council Meeting.

Because of questions raised over two disbursements (April DC \$1903.02 and Officer Expenses \$2604.99) listed on the 01 Sep 2009 - 01 Sep 2010 Receipts and Disbursement Report compiled by the Treasurer General, which could not be answered since she was not in attendance, it was agreed that the Governor General would request the Treasurer General to send, by email, before the closing of her books (31 September 2010) a full report to clarify these expenses. The report is to be sent to all members of the incoming (2010-2012) and outgoing (2008-2010) Executive Boards and Honoraries and current State Governors.

The following recommendations from the Executive Board were read by the Recording Secretary and adopted:

- (1) Moved to recommend to the Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars that all chapters as of this date are "grand fathered" and are not required to comply with the CSDIW Bylaw, Article XII, Section 7, that reads: "The name of a chapter shall be confined to a location near where it is organized, with the approval of the Executive Board."
- (2) Moved that we approve the 2010-2011 budget.
- (3) Moved that expenses of this 22nd Annual Council be paid.

A motion was made and adopted that all reports of Continental Chairman and State Governors not present at the Annual Council Meeting be filed. The motion was adopted.

State Governors reporting at the meeting were: Alabama, Margaret Simmons; Georgia, Robin Towns; Massachusetts, Susan Chamberlain; Michigan, Leslie Reynolds for Twila Helderich; Missouri, Jan Stevens; Oklahoma, Sharon Champlin; Texas, Mary Walker; Virginia, Sharon Stine.

State reports received and filed by the Recording Secretary General were: Alberta/Arizona; California; District of Columbia; Florida; Iowa.

Continental Committee reports given/received and filed were: Archive-- Karen Hall, Finance--Barbara Griffith, Handbook--Sharon Stine, Insignia--Mary Jo Mordhorst, Lineage Book--Denise Rice, Printing--Marcia Weber, Scholarship--Julia Farrigan, Scholarship Pins--Susan Chamberlain, Yearbook--Helene Werner.

2010 Scholarship recipients were:

- Benjamin C. Young of the Haida and Tlinglit tribes, whose project is to save the Haida language.
- Keelee Lynn Hilton of the Cherokee tribe who is completing her college program in Agricultural Education.

Nominating Committee Chairman Mary Walker presented the slate of officers for 2010-2012 who were accepted by acclamation. Mary thanked her committee for their participation, Carla Odom and Judy Farrigan.

The meeting was recessed for lunch at 11:50 am and reconvened at 1:50 pm.

Proposed bylaw amendments were presented by Bylaws Chairman, Shelby Ward. They are outlined as follows:

Adopted as amended – Article IV, Section 2, Officers — delete the entire section and add a new Section 2, to read:

“The Nominating Committee shall consist of three members and all three shall be elected at the Annual meeting of the year preceding elections. The member receiving the most votes shall be chairman. No two shall be nominated from the same state. No one who served on the previous nominating committee is eligible to succeed herself. An elected officer may not serve until she has been out of office one full term year.” (Strikeout “term” and amend proposed bylaw by inserting “year”)

Adopted — Article IV, Section 3, Duties of Officers — delete the last sentence of Section 3 and move it to the Corresponding Secretary General’s duties. Section 3 (Second Deputy Governor General) to then read:

“The Second Deputy Governor General shall perform the duties of the First Deputy Governor in her absence.”

Then the Corresponding Secretary General duties would read:

“The Corresponding Secretary General shall conduct correspondence of the Society not assigned to others and shall issue such notices as shall be ordered by the Executive Board or requested by the Governor General. She shall read all reports of the absent Officers, Chairmen and State/ Provincial Governors.”

Adopted — Article VII, Section 2, Executive Board — “add email or other electronic media” to read:

“The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Society between its Council business meetings, at a time and place agreed to by members of the Executive Board. It shall make recommendations to the Society, and shall perform such other duties as are specified by these Bylaws. The Board shall be subject to the orders of the Society, and none shall conflict with action taken by the Society. The Governor General, at her discretion, may solicit the vote of the Executive Board by mail or by telephone, email or other electronic media.”

Referred Back to the Bylaw Committee — Article XII, Chapters, Section 2, Primary Chapters and Section 3, Secondary Chapters.

NOT adopted — Article XII, Chapters, Section 4 and Section 5 — changes to Member At Large status

Adopted — Article XII, Chapters, Section 6 — Organizing Chapters, to read:

“No chapter organizing under any of the provisions of this section shall be recognized as a chapter until a copy of the Minutes of the organizing meeting and Bylaws have been sent in duplicate to the Continental Executive Board for verification and approval.”

Amended and Adopted — Article XII, Chapters, Section 7 — Chapter names, to read:

“The name of a Chapter shall be confined to a location, historical event or an Indian name within our historical period.” (Proposal amended to include “historical event or an Indian name within our historical period.”)

NEW BUSINESS

It was moved and adopted that the Treasurer General’s books be audited by a professional CPA by 31 October 2010. The books are to be closed by the outgoing Treasurer General, Barbara Griffith, by 30 September 2010 and all files forwarded to the incoming Treasurer General, Julia Farrigan, who will see that the books are professionally audited.

The Texas Society presented a donation check of \$100 – to be divided evenly between the Society’s two scholarship funds.

The Michigan Society presented a check for \$25 to be given to the Atlanta History Center Library Wish List toward the purchase of Volume 12 of the *Cherokee’s By Blood* series.

A Memorial Service was performed by Chaplain General Karen Hall with the assistance of Recording Secretary General Karen Miller and Historian General Carla Odom.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:05 pm.

- Upon approval by the State/Provincial Society or the Governor General, she shall pay a reinstatement fee plus current Chapter, State/Provincial and Continental Dues.

Bylaws

Anne Winn, Chairman

Bylaws as we know and understand, are the most important document of an organization. They state what rights and how much power the members and officers have within the organization. These are the documents that contain a society's *own basic rules, relating principally to itself as an organization, rather than the parliamentary procedure it follows.*

Per Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised (10th ed.), pp.12-13, the Parliamentary Authority for CSDIW: *bylaws, define the primary characteristics of our society and prescribe how the society functions, including all rules that the society considers so important that they cannot be changed without previous notice to the members and the vote of a specified large majority, and cannot be suspended except under special pre described conditions.*

Therefore, it is our obligation as members of the Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars to attend to our own Bylaws, over our governing bodies whether we are Continental, State/ Province or in Chapters. Once established with approval of the Continental Society, Bylaws are simple to maintain and should be amended as needed with ongoing attention to insure they are in direct accordance with the Continental Society. In a Chapter, the Bylaws must be in compliance with those of the Continental and State/Provincial Societies, under whom the chapter operates.

VERY IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO ALL STATE/PROVINCIAL GOVERNORS:

As the Continental Bylaws Chairman, I am requesting that each Chapter/State/Province of the Continental Society send a copy of its current operating Bylaws for review by the CSDIW Bylaws Committee, Anne H. The CSDIW awards \$5000 annually in college scholarships to Native American students. Applications must be submitted to the Scholarship Chairman by 15 June 2011.

APPLICANT REQUIREMENTS

- (1) Be an enrolled tribal member.
- (2) Plan to work with a tribe or nation in the field of Education or Social Services.
- (3) Be accepted in, or already attend an accredited college or university, enrolled in an undergraduate program and preferably entering or in his/her Junior year.
- (4) Maintain a 3.0 average and carry at least 10 (ten) quarter hours or 8 (eight) semester hours. This allows for a work/study program and is required for consideration.

Sacajawea

Born circa 1788-90, in current day Idaho, Sacajawea's young life was one of change and challenge. She was born into the Shoshone tribe but kidnaped by the Hidatsa tribe as a young girl and taken to live in North Dakota. Before the age of 16 she was made the wife of French-Canadian fur trapper, Toussaint Charbonneau. He joined the Lewis & Clark Expedition as an interpreter and she was allowed to travel along with the expectation that her translation skills might prove valuable with the Shoshone Indians. She was pregnant with her first child and before the party left North Dakota she gave birth to a son named Jean Baptiste Charbonneau. The baby traveled with his parents. In the records of the expedition she is recorded as very helpful and cheerful in the face of hardships. At one point her quick actions saved valuable instruments and written records in a boating accident. She was able to help bargain for an exchange of horses with her tribesmen. Her actual death date is not known and several conflicting stories surround the subject.





A "Parliamentary Minute"

Did you know the Articles of the Bylaws of a group have a specific form and order? They may diverge from the standard, but student parliamentarians use this mnemonic device to remember the order: "No Mommy, see Pa." Or, it is written "NO MOME C PA," which are the first letters of: Name, Object, Members, Officers, Meetings, Executive (Board), Committees, Parliamentary (Authority) and Amendments. One additional article is included in most societies and specifies how assets are to be managed in the event of dissolution.

The articles define the rights of the members as well as the duties and limitations of the officers. When the bylaws are incomplete or do not provide for a specific circumstance, it is customary to refer to the "parliamentary authority" which is not a person, but a book. In our society, the parliamentary authority is *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised*. This is often abbreviated as RONR.

As the needs and circumstances of groups evolve, it is necessary to revise the bylaws. This is done by amending the bylaws. The article on amendments specifies how this is to take place and how much notice must be given before the amendments are presented for a vote. In most instances, it requires a two-thirds vote of members present to pass an amendment provided that advance notice has been given. This may seem laborious, but it is to protect the members and preserve the intended objects of a society. Bylaws are not meant to be changed frequently. Some items that relate to the administration of a group may need to be changed more often. It is best to place these in the "Standing Rules". Standing Rules do not require previous notice and may be adopted by a majority vote at any business meeting.

Dorothy was a very proud mother and grandmother, often relating stories of her granddaughter's missionary work for many years in China.

Dorothy was a founding member of the CSDIW, Continental Number 21, her ancestor being Jacob Van Meter of Virginia and Kentucky. He was an Ensign in the French and Indian War. Dorothy was the first State Governor in Georgia, serving from 1989-1991. Following in the footsteps of the Society's Founder, she became the second Governor General of the Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars, serving from 1994-1996. She was a member of the Coweta Chapter in Georgia.

She also served as the President General of the National Society Dames of the Court of Honor 1999-2001. Dorothy was very proud of her early work with the Children of the American Revolution and was a member of many hereditary societies such as the Daughters of the American Revolution, National Huguenot Society, Daughters of the War of 1812, Daughters of American Colonists, Colonial Dames of the XVII Century, Magna Charta Dames and Barons, Daughters of Colonial Wars and United Daughters of the Confederacy. She was also a member of the Eastern Star.

After her husband's death, it was very difficult to see her decline in spirit and health until her death.

- Applications will be processed and returned at the end of each month. When the CSDIW number is assigned, the Registrar General will be glad to email the information to you. Please provide your email address.
